

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Now that our Lenten Journey has concluded, we find ourselves standing at the threshold of April. The echoes of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the empty tomb still resonate in our hearts. We've witnessed the powerful words spoken by Jesus during the Last Supper: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of your sins" (Mt 26:28). We've stood at the foot of the cross, hearing His lonely cry: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Mk 15:34). And we've rejoiced at the empty tomb, where the angels declared: "He is not here, but has risen" (Lk 24:6).

But now what? The Day of Resurrection is behind us, yet Easter is more than just one day. It's an "every Sunday" celebration—a time when we gather to receive the fruit of the cross and the resurrection: forgiveness of sins and the certainty of eternal life with God. But it's also an "every day" celebration—a life lived in trust, knowing that Jesus is "the resurrection and the life" (Jn 11:25) for us

We too are "every day" witnesses and participants in the resurrection of Jesus:

- We believe and are baptized.
- We hold the hope of eternal life.
- We carry the joy of the Resurrection within us.

Our abilities and talents are gifts from God. As we go forth from the empty tomb, let's proclaim the good news, not only within our church walls but also in our workplaces, homes, and communities.

A New Beginning, Again

We, too, are being "resurrected" and transformed. In the coming months we will be making changes to our building, our worship, and our forms of communication. All so we made better share our Resurrection stories with each other and our community. It is a scaring prospect, change, yet if we remember the purpose of this resurrection is so we can better follow in the footsteps of Jesus, and know he walks with us, there is nothing to fear.

I am looking forward to our new sign, my first Rummage sale with FCC and planning for Spring and Summer.

So hang on to your hats, we are in for a ride. I pray it will be one with minimal bumps and will continue the current revival in our congregation.

Let us continue to be revitalized by the resurrection, remembering what God has done for us already. May we proclaim His Word in the best ways we can.

May this April be a season of resurrection stories—both ancient and new—as we live out our faith, empowered by the risen Christ.

You may start dropping your items off after church on April 21st. All sales are by donation. We will need volunteer's, to help set up, break down and work the sale.




Face Book Page



WE will be looking at ways to revitalize how we share worship with those outside of the building and how to make new traditions which honor the past but belong to Faith Community Church.


